### **POSITION DESCRIPTION:**

The Registered Practical Nurse – Mental Health Community Case Manager, functions as a member of the clinical team to provide basic assessment and treatments, preventative, educational and/or supportive care. Under direction from the Manager and Director, basic knowledge, decision making and communication techniques are employed in providing nursing care to one or more individuals with mental health and/or addiction issues. In addition, the Registered Practical Nurse – Mental Health Community Case Manager will work collaboratively with other services within the Integrated Mental Health Program as well as community agencies to increase throughput of referred clients. This position will act as a resource to both the inpatient and outpatient teams to enhance, augment and further develop the transition of clients into the community.

### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Successful completion of a provincially recognized educational program for a Registered Practical Nurse (full scope of practice) and current registration with the Ontario College of Nurses in good standing
- Certificate in Mental Health nursing or willing to achieve within first year of employment
- ASSIST Training, CPR certificate, Asepsis Technique and Medication Administration certificate, and CPI Certification. Case Management Certificate / diploma preferred
- Minimum of 1-year recent experience in psychiatric mental health nursing, concurrent disorder experience preferred. As accompanied with a minimum of two (2) years' experience in a comparable outreach role working with individuals with serious and persistent mental illness
- Knowledge of therapeutic communication and counselling with a clear ability to apply that knowledge to practice
- Valid Drivers' License and consistent access to a reliable vehicle
