



Two pathways to support care for seniors outside the walls of LTC

LTC Seniors' Without Walls Hubs

Supporting Healthcare Excellence Canada's Pan-Canadian spread

Becoming a Jurisdictional Lead to spread LTC without walls model where LTC provides social supports for those living in community

Integrated care for seniors with LTC at centre

Health and social care models that integrated health and social care partners with LTC serving as a coordinating and navigation hub

New Brunswick's Nursing Home Without Walls

NB's model enables LTC homes to serve seniors within their local communities.

Their model is primarily focused on social care, wellness, and connecting seniors to services and the health care system when needed.

The model is explicitly not health care.

Snapshot of NB roll out:

- 2019-2023: 4 Pilot sites •
- March 2025: 27 sites, with plans to scale to all homes in NB that volunteer
- 98% of older adults felt NHWW helped them stay home longer

Estimated cost: 150 to 250K per home.



Spreading to Ontario

There are two key programs focused on models similar to LTC without walls in Ontario:

Community Access to LTC program

- \$15 million over two years
- access to certain services in long-term care homes, such as personal care, clinical services, and recreational and social programming.
- Initial pilot of 3 homes

Healthcare Excellence Canada NHWW Pan-Canadian Spread

- Funding jurisdictional leads to spread in each province and territory – 250k
- Spread supported over three years, with expectation of finding other funding sources



Seniors' Hubs

- A campus of care that offers a mix of services to support seniors in the community.
- Seniors Hubs bring the community into LTC homes and extends their services beyond the walls.
- Co-located with other community services such as diagnostics, primary care and pharmacy that allows seniors to access essential services in one place.
- Important support for those on the wait list for LTC and their caregivers.

Community Support Services (CSS) We believe in making community matter – one client at a time. Programs include Adult Day program, Meals on Wheel Friendly Visiting, Safety and Security, Social recreation, Support groups, Sup

Internal Medicine Clinic The Internal Medicine Clinic provides assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and term care from an internal medicine specialist who meet specific qualificat professional.

Physiotherapy As primary health care professionals, physiotherapists (also known as PTs knowledge of how the body works with specialized hands-on clinical skills t injuries, lineses and conditions. The team offers outpatient appointments who are under the age of 19 or over the age of 65.
